





Number of TerraCycle items recycled to date: OVER 72,000!

I am thrilled to announce that we have collected 72,000 pieces of TerraCycle! That's 4,000 over our goal of 68,000 with 6 more weeks of school to go! I will contact the Seahawks soon and let them know! Thank you to everyone who has contributed from home and work and all the teachers and students who have made sure their snack wrappers make it into a TerraCycle box in the classroom.

Even more impressive is that we have all established a strong habit of recycling and maybe even reducing a bit. As a result,

we have not had to increase our dumpster size or pickup days even though we have 75 more students this year. That's less trash going to the landfill which is great for the environment. Reaching our goal doesn't mean we stop recycling, though.

The habit lives on so keep

Terracycle Items we collect from home:

Cereal Bags, Chip/Popcorn/Pretzel/Cracker Bags, Granola/Energy Bar Wrappers, Applesauce/Yogurt Pouches with Lids, Clean Lunchable Trays, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste Tubes, Floss Boxes and Deodorant Containers.
