> O that all Life were but a Day Sunny and sweet and sane! And that at Even I might say: "I sleep to wake again."



Our 2017/18 Goal is to: REDUCE then RECYCLE

Goals/progress:

Students who have taken Chip Bag Challenge:

Pounds of compost saved from landfill: 1,000+lbs (goal is 2000lbs)

Pieces of TerraCycle + Lunchables: 12,000+ (goal is 35,000)

Tacoma Recycle Center Plastics: 7 sixty-gallon bags (*rigid and stretchy plastic*)

We are almost half way through our 3rd year as a Washington Green School! That's a big deal! I hope that what you and your kids learn and do at school has begun to change how you recycle at home whether you are a beginner or experienced. If you are curious about how your lifestyle effects the environment, there is a short environmental footprint quiz you can take on-line to help you gain perspective: www.footprintcalculator.org

If you are as surprised by the results as I was, consider choosing 1 new green action below as a new year's resolution. After trying it for a while maybe it will even become a green habit that you can build on! Life Skills students also took the quiz before the break and chose one thing to try *(see asterisks)*. If you decide to participate, please share your 1 action and how it went on the PTA Facebook page. It's easier to create a new habit with support!

- Recycle all paper/cardboard*
- Forgo 1 case of bottled water and use reusable water bottles for a month instead
- Recycle every beverage bottle you use *(even if it means holding onto it until you find a recycle bin)**
- Finish all your food at meals*
- Put fresh fruits and veggie scraps (nothing canned) in your yard waste bin at home
- Eat 1 vegetarian meal per week for a month
- Take the Chip Bag Challenge one time (*Translation: Only buy 10 ounce bags of chips or larger instead of single-serving bags. Pack chips in reusable containers.*)* See PTA website for details.
- Pour all leftover water found in cups or old water bottles around the house into a pitcher. Water plants, rinse recycle or pre-rinse dirty dishes or pots and pans with it.
- Carpool once a month*
- Buy your next piece of clothing, purse, kitchen utensil or storage bin at a thrift store
- Turn off the water when washing hands, dishes or brushing your teeth—every time*
- Turn of lights in empty rooms-every time*
- Unplug power strips and computers when not in use.
 Keep a bin of G.O.O.S. (*Good On One Side*) paper handy for notes, lists, drawing or math homework.
- Buy a Tesla* (yep, creative Life Skills student came up with that)



Thank you Walmart for continuing to fund shipping for chip bags we collect on campus! We encourage you to take the Chip Bag Challenge if you pack chips in your child's lunch frequently. Buying a 10 oz bag or larger and bringing chips to lunch in reusable containers can save 50-75% of the packaging and 50-75% of the carbon emissions it takes to ship them to New Jersey.
