Take the time to vote YES for the bond!

Only 20% of parents who are registered to vote, voted last year. This is why our PTA is taking a particularly strong stance this year. We know sign-waving, texts and email haven't worked up to this point, but mobilizing parents and their neighbors to vote will.

Bonds have to pass with a 60% yes vote, not a simple majority (51%). Last year, we got to 54%. Even though it's only a 6% gap, it's a lot more individual votes.

Here are some reasons to vote yes and to encourage your neighbors to vote yes!

- If the bond passes, the portion of property taxes that fund education will actually go down. This will not be the case the next time the district tries to pass a bond.
- If the bond passes, Elk Plain will remain a K-8 School of Choice with an emphasis in the Arts & Sciences. We will also get a new multi-purpose building where the historical building now sits. This building would house classrooms and shared spaces for our ever-growing K-8 program. A shining example of what a bond can do for Elk Plain is the addition that was built a few years ago, which included the multi-purpose room, the stage/theater classroom, the state-ofthe-art audio system, and the music room. It also funded our redesigned parking lot, bus loop and play shed. If the bond does not pass, there is a chance Elk Plain will revert back to a K-5 neighborhood school. This means potentially no more arts and science emphasis and no more School of Choice. There has been a school on this site since 1892, and it has always changed for the better throughout history. Let's not let it take a step backwards on our watch!
- A track system, year-round school is not a good idea. Bethel's year-round schools would be very different than the year-round school system

used in California. It would be a 9 weeks on/3 weeks off schedule with no guarantee that siblings will be on the same track. Teachers would have to share rooms with other teachers and return to a different room after the 3-week break. This system would have significant, negative effects on student learning and competitive sports.

It is our sincere hope that every parent or guardian at Elk Plain will vote in the upcoming election. There is still time to register if you need to. The last day to register online is October 8th. Visit www.yesbethelkids.com for the voter registration website. The last day to register to vote in person is October 29th.

Ballots should arrive in mailboxes by October 25th. All ballots need to be postmarked by November 6th. Please visit the Bond 2018 page at bethelsd.org for more bond related facts and videos.

I feel stronger when I'm outdoors part of the day, wiser when I remember I'm not in this alone, and a better person when I acknowledge I'm affecting everything around me.


That may not be all of it, but there's a little of who I am. Now the question is Who Are You?

Elk Plain is starting our 4th year as a Washington Green School! I also want to welcome Raeann O'Neil to the Sustainability Committee. She has been enthusiastically helping in the lunchroom, planning and daydreaming with me about what else we can do for the earth. Thank you, Raeann! Leadership continues to collect from classrooms and spread the word about proper recycling habits. 6-8th grade students who take the debate elective with Ms. Larsen are also learning about the detrimental effects plastics have on the environment.

In 2017/18:

- We collected over 35,000 pieces of TerraCycle and other food packaging.
- Composted over a ton of produce scraps from the lunchroom.
- Reduced the amount of trash we put in the dumpster dramatically.
- A water bottle filling station was donated to the school from the Pierce County Solid Waste Department.

Our 2018/2019 Goals are:

- Continue to reduce the number of singleuse water/beverage bottles used on campus.
- Collect 36,000 pieces of TerraCycle and other food packaging (an increase of 1,000 pieces).
- Compost all the fruits and veggies **scraps** from the 6th-8th grade lunch shift.
- Encourage zero-waste lunches with incentives and prizes (more about that to come).
