

Meeting called to order: 6:35pm

Minutes were reviewed. Christine Link motioned to approve, Kendra Williamson seconded. Minutes were voted on, approved and filed. Budget was reviewed and filed.

New Business:

- -Jennifer Harisson discussed (as a rep. for "Bethel Citizens for School Support", not as a staff member) the impact of the 2014 Levy. If passed it would increase the current rate by .97 per \$1000 of income. This money would support among other things, school programs and Operations. Please vote!
- -Becky Ortega made a motion for the PTA members to discuss the Levy, Staci Sherrod seconded. Motion was passed and the Levy was discussed by members.
- -Door prizes were awarded.
- -Brenda Pattee requested a Grant to renew the AR Program. The cost is \$3,383.04. Staci Sherrod motioned to approve the grant, Christina Plack seconded. Motion was approved.

- -Book fair profits were \$250 more than expected with a total earning of \$1,250.
