



What's A Mother To Worry About?

A bone chilling 10 degrees outside and my son was not wearing gloves! Put your gloves on, I rebuked! He insisted that his hands were fine in his pockets, although one finger did feel a touch numb. I reiterated my admonishment; always carry gloves when walking outside in the cold. Don't worry, mom, he responded. Don't worry! Don't worry? Not something a mother is apt to do, not worry. But a conversation texted by phone 2,500 miles across the country does not sustain the direness of a situation, as the proximity of an anxious, handwringing, frothing at the mouth mother is likely to produce.

As my children grow older I am struggling to let go of my prime parenting activity ~ worrying! The mainstay of my life, and the thing that often gets me up in the morning, the chance to worry about my three children. They will soon all be gone, full time, from home so now I am worried about what I will worry about.

Recently, however, I discovered a potentially new avenue for my worry. It happened this past January in two different venues like lightening striking you twice. Obviously, I didn't get the first idea and needed to be hit in my ear, as it were, to understand the depth of need for my personal concern.

One night while taking the dog out I heard my newest worry in the dormant cut leaf maple by my front door. It was a wet January evening that

happened to be unseasonable warm and a frog had decided it was time to do some "singing"? My mom mode went instantly into overdrive. Doesn't this

frog know its taken to the night air in the wrong month? Who let this frog out without his tiny froggy gloves and hat? And where was his coat? I was cold so this frog must wear a coat! Really, this is not acceptable, and more importantly, dangerous to the frog's long-term health.

This is the perfect worry for me since frogs are already on my personal radar and are an important aspect of my life. Every spring I look forward to, and take special note of, the advent of chorus frog singing. I happily stand outside listening to the evening event serenading me from the neighboring wetlands filling the night air, sometimes deafeningly so, with frog song.

The second lightening strike was an article in the Tacoma News Triune

about some recently published frog research. It appears that frog scientists (more properly called herpetologists) discovered the singing of certain frogs triggered the sonar of bats who have evolved to eat said frogs! Like the tolling of a dinner bell the frog chorus calls the bats to their meal. This


