

What wonderful characteristics for our kids to aspire to as they make their way through elementary school!


Box tops and Labels

SAFETY PTA Helps You Prepare for the Unexpected

Are you ready for the unexpected? As part of the Elk Plain School of Choice Disaster Readiness Plan, we ask that the children have an Emergency Kits at school.

Kits are available for purchase at cost (not a fundraiser) from the PTA. The kits have a 5-year shelf life and contain a 3-day minimum support of food, water, solar blanket, 12 hour

light stick, hand wipes and a Red Cross emergency guide in a small bag.

The kits are stored in your child's classroom, and moved to their new class at the end of the school year or sent home upon transfer or if the kit expires.* If you are purchasing this for home/car use, please indicate that on the order form and it will be sent home with your child.

To purchase, please fill out the information below and send either a check

or money order made out to EPSOC PTA. At \$10.50 (\$2.10 per year!), the kit is an economical way to assure your child's readiness.
