DIVERSIONS from Mrs. Park
"Clouds come floating into my life, no longer to carry rain or usher storm, but to add color to my sunset sky." $\sim$ Rabindranath Tagore

Up in the sky ... it's a bird, it's a plane, no ... it's a visible mass of liquid droplets condensed in the troposphere forming a cumulonimbus! Or, in normall parlance $\sim$ a cloud.

Spring is an excellent time in Western Washington to cloud watch and check out all the different shapes, sizes, and types. The weather rolls through heralded by the clouds in the sky. And we may think they are there just for our enjoyment but in actuality clouds are part of an intricate system designed to recycle and reuse the earth's water.

Nephology is the name for the study or contemplation of clouds. Cloud types and heights are varied and complex, dutifully classified by scientists. A thorough science, Nephology is based on the amount of water vapor in the cloud, shape the cloud manifests, and likelihood of the clouds behavior (rain or not). I, on the other hand, have my own classification system $\sim$ clouds that look like pirate ships, ones that appear as various animals (lots of ducks and bunnies), mountains, trains, and sometimes even people. clouds float across the sky, is by no means a waste of time." John Lubbock

So this summer please spend some time doing nothing, and doing that nothing as a family. Do nothing together; watch grass, stare at stars, observe ants, be mesmerized by waves on the beach, count trees on the mountain, and especially contemplate the clouds in the sky. That one looks like a duck, or a pirate ship, a dragon, or a castle. Do it for me so I wont look so gosh darn silly ... always looking up!
